

ORDINANCE NO. 213

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF EAST LAMPETER, LANCASTER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 116 WHICH REGULATES TRAFFIC AND PARKING IN THE TOWNSHIP, BY AMENDING ARTICLE III, SECTION 2, SUBPARAGRAPH (a) OF SAID ORDINANCE PROHIBITING PARKING IN CERTAIN LOCATIONS

WHEREAS, on September 14, 1987, the Township of East Lampeter adopted Ordinance No. 116, as amended by Ordinance Nos. 118, 152 and 158, regulating traffic and parking in the Township and repealing all prior ordinances inconsistent therewith; and

WHEREAS, the Township is now desirous of amending Article III, Section 2, Subparagraph (a) of said Ordinance for the purpose of prohibiting parking at all times in certain locations in the Township of East Lampeter.

NOW THEREFORE, BE AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED AND ENACTED as follows:

1. That Article III, Section 2, Subparagraph (a) of said Ordinance is amended to include the following streets within the following areas as streets upon which parking is prohibited at all times:

<u>Street</u>	<u>Side</u>	<u>Between</u>
William Penn Way	North	Olde Homestead Lane 544' east to posted sign And 510' west to posted sign
Olde Homestead Lane	Both	William Penn Way and 437' north to posted sign


2. All other provisions of Ordinance No. 116, as amended from time to time, shall

remain in full force and effect as heretofore adopted.

3. This Ordinance shall become effective five (5) days after the date of its enactment.
